What is PREVENT?

Prevent is about safeguarding people and communities from the threat of terrorism. Prevent is the Government's counter-terrorism strategy. It aims to stop people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorism.

As your training provider, we have a responsibility to ensure that you are aware of your responsibilities under the Prevent strategy.

What can you do?

To support the Government's Prevent strategy, every citizen is responsible for looking out for, and reporting signs of extremism and radicalisation.

This may be:

- Exposure to the extremist actions, views or material of people
- Graffiti symbols, writing or art work promoting extremist messages
- Accessing extremist material online, including through social networking sites
- Changes in behaviour or actions
- Voicing opinions drawn from extremist ideologies and narratives
- Use of extremist or hate terms to exclude or incite violence
- Intolerance of difference, whether secular or religious or views on, but not exclusive to, gender, disability, homophobia, race, colour or culture
- Attempts to impose extremist views or practises on others
- Anti-western or Anti- British views
